I know the first five cube numbers

Children should know that a cube number is any number multiplied by itself three times.

n x n x n.

It can be written as n³

The first five cube numbers are:

| x | x | = |

2 x 2 x 2 = 8

3 x 3 x 3 = 27

4 x 4 x 4 = 64

5 x 5 x 5 = 125
